- 1.3 **Approval of Potential Facade Preservation Pilot Program** - At its July 9, 2009 meeting, the Economic Development Committee considered a potential Facade Covenant Program requested by the Southwest Neighborhood Economic Improvement Action Group, which would create an incentive for commercial property owners to pursue small-scale facade projects that would result in noticeable improvements to a building. The Committee directed staff to draft program guidelines and revisit the Committee for further discussion.

Senior Planner Shawn Tillman provided a draft Administrative Procedure & Policy (AP&P) that would implement the Facade Preservation Covenant Pilot Program. This pilot project would allocate \$75,000 from the total \$3 million allocation in the Capital Improvement Program for the implementation of the Southwest Neighborhood Plan.

A motion by Councilmember Holcombe to approve the draft Administrative Procedure & Policy, with the value of the covenant to be set at 50% of the eligible costs incurred for the improvements, up to a maximum amount of \$7,500, was seconded by Councilmember Schwab. The motion passed (3-0)

Recommendation: The Committee recommended (3-0) to approve the draft Administrative Procedure & Policy, with the value of the covenant to be set at 50% of the eligible costs incurred for the improvements, up to a maximum of \$7,500.

- 1.1. **Approval of Priority Projects for the 2010-11 Update of the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for the Federal Economic Development Administration (EDA)** - Economic Development/Redevelopment Manager Wescoat-Andes presented an updated list of potential projects that could be submitted for federal EDA funding. The City is eligible to apply for EDA funding through its district membership administered by 3CORE.

A motion by Mayor Schwab to approve the following list of priority projects for 2010-11 update of the CEDS for submission to EDA was seconded by Chair Flynn. The motion passed (3-0).

Priority A Projects – Immediate

1. **Infrastructure improvements** (technical assistance – public works construction on roads and bridges, storm drainage, frontage roads, offsite improvements, communication enhancements, green technology, etc.) that increase access, connectivity, capacity and utilization of major employment centers in Chico where jobs are created/retained for the North State region.

Primary focus areas include:

- A) South Chico corridor from Skyway/SR 99 west to South Chico and east to Paradise;
- B) Chico Municipal Airport improvements not covered by the FAA such as terminal expansion for increased commercial air service, hangars, infrastructure to undeveloped land, solar, etc.
- C) East 20th Street Corridor SR 99 to Office/Commercial Region.
- D) Commercial/industrial opportunity site development (including Brownfield redevelopment) as identified in the General Plan Update

Estimated Investment: Technical Assistance \$50,000-150,000; construction \$500,000 - 2 million
Projected Jobs: 50-1,000

2. **Reuse/redeployment of vacant industrial and commercial buildings** (technical assistance – construction including façade improvements, infrastructure upgrades, etc.).

Primary focus areas include:

- A) North Chico - Chico Municipal Airport Region
- B) South Chico - Hegan Lane Industrial Region

Estimated Investment: Technical Assistance \$50,000-150,000; construction \$100,000 - 2 million
Projected Jobs: 50-1,000

3. **Innovation Cluster Building** - partnership projects that drive technology commercialization and entrepreneurship in the North State region. One example includes the new regional partnership with the Workforce Investment Board, University, private developers, private entrepreneurial businesses and City known around the Clean/Green Tech Innovation Center in South Chico. Other

clusters of potential focus include technology and laser.
Estimated Investment: Up to \$1 million
Projected Jobs: 50-1000

Priority B Projects – Near Term (5 yrs.)

1. **Public private partnership projects** designed to spur private investment in underutilized opportunity areas identified in the General Plan Update and/or Economic Strategy.

Estimated Investment: Technical Assistance \$50,000-150,000; construction \$100,000 - 2 million
Projected Jobs: 50-1000

Priority C Projects – Long Term

1. **Increase access from interchanges on Highway 99** including frontage roads and east-west connectors (e.g. Southgate, Eaton, Cohasset, etc.)

Estimated Investment: Technical Assistance \$50,000-150,000; construction \$1-2 million
Projected Jobs: 50-1,000

2. **Increase access between Interstate 5 and Airport** along Eaton Road Corridor including extension.

Estimated Investment: Technical Assistance \$50,000 - 150,000; construction \$1-2 million
Projected Jobs: 50-1,000

3. **Other infrastructure development for General Plan** long term build out

Estimated Investment: Technical Assistance \$50,000-150,000; construction \$1-2 million
Projected Jobs: 50-1,000

- 1.2. **Update on the Chico Fiber Initiative** - In March of 2010, on behalf of the Chico Fiber Initiative, the City of Chico responded to a Request for Information (RFI) to be selected by Google in their Community Broadband Initiative. During the application process, a high level of interest was expressed by businesses, higher educational entities, and individuals in Chico. As a result, discussions have continued about alternatives to build an ultra high-speed Internet project as a means to increase economic growth if Chico is not selected by Google. Bob Linscheid, of CEPSCO, provided the update.

- 1.1. **Update on Application Submitted for North State iHUB Designation** - Audrey Taylor, (on behalf of NoRTEC), and Jon Gregory, (Golden Capital Network(GCN)) provided an overview of the benefits of and the potential impact of the application submitted in July to the Governor's Office of Economic Development(GOED) for the Innovation Hub Initiative. Final confirmation and designation as the North State iHub, has been received. The goal of the North State iHub is to leverage the strengths and collaborative work efforts of existing regional partners to drive and develop new technologies and commercialization. This would be done by creating an environment which accesses CSU, Chico's talent and applied research as well as accesses capital that is not typically available to entrepreneurs and technologies developed in the North State.

The iHub will be anchored in Chico at the new Innovation Lab. GCN and CSU, Chico, School of Engineering, Sustainable Manufacturing Program will manage and outreach to businesses throughout the North State to accelerate commercialization and capital access for growth companies. The iHUB Application was sponsored by NoRTEC/PIC as part of the recently awarded Green Challenge Grant for commercialization to further recognize the region as an Innovation Hub.

The CleanTech Innovation Center in Oroville, a clean energy campus, will focus on clean energy training, demonstration/test site for new energy technologies, green products and zero waste management. Tech Teams will work directly with businesses and projects.

Gregory stated the university, city, and private sector would be involved. Companies would be targeted at those in duration of seven years or less. There are four types of companies: 1) Start-up company; 2) Game Changers; 3) Mid-market, more established, mid-sized companies and 4) regional lifestyle companies that can create 5, 10, or 20 jobs).

Taylor reported that this designation is California's first **rural** iHub. The role of the iHub is not to attract businesses, it is to build from within.

The process for access to the iHub will be through an application, which is being developed.

1.2. **Update on Status of Buildings Formerly Occupied By Aero Union**

In June, 2010, the City was informed that Aero Union would be relocating its corporate headquarters and principal business operations from the Chico Municipal Airport to McClellan Air Park in McClellan, California (Sacramento), effective September 1, 2010. City Manager, Dave Burkland, provided an update on the City's efforts and plan to lease the buildings which were formerly occupied by Aero Union.
