


POLICE COMMUNITY ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERS

Matthew Madden started his career with the Yuba County Sheriff's Department in January, 1993 and was hired by the Chico Police Department in July 1997. During his career, he has been a member of the SWAT Team, detective bureau, Sergeant in charge of patrol, Street Crimes/Gang Unit, School Resource Officers, Field Training Officers, and the Detective Bureau. In 2011, he became the Chico SWAT team leader. He promoted to Lieutenant after serving as interim for five months on November 1, 2015 and moved to the Administrative Lieutenant position. He was promoted to Deputy Chief on March 5, 2017 and Chief of Police on August 30, 2020.
